

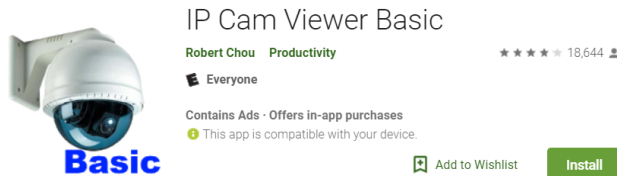

Berkeley Island Marine has installed security web cams so you can check on your boat and the conditions of the bay without leaving the comfort of your own home. The instructions below show Apple iPhone instructions, but Android devices are very similar just the screens may look a little different. (sometimes you have to scroll below the keyboard on some Android for selections). Follow the steps below to install 2 cameras available to our loyal slip customers.

1. Go onto Google Play or the APP store, search for “IP Cam Viewer”, select the Lite or Basic version, and download it to your device. This app is free, but there are pro versions that cost money, you don’t need them.

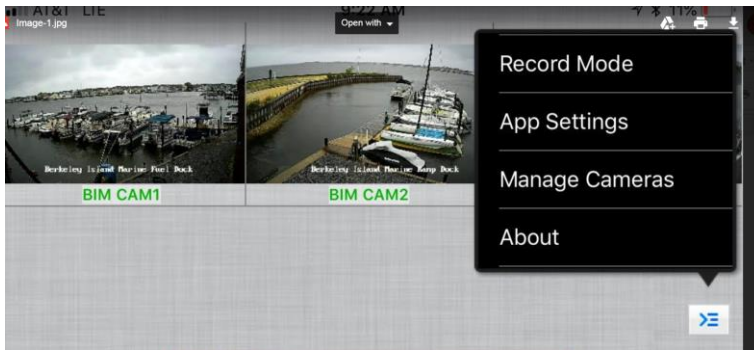


2. Once installed, select the drop down menus circled below, find **Manage Cameras**. There will be 2 or 3 random default cameras in there already on some versions of phones, don’t worry about this just yet. Some phones have no default cameras.

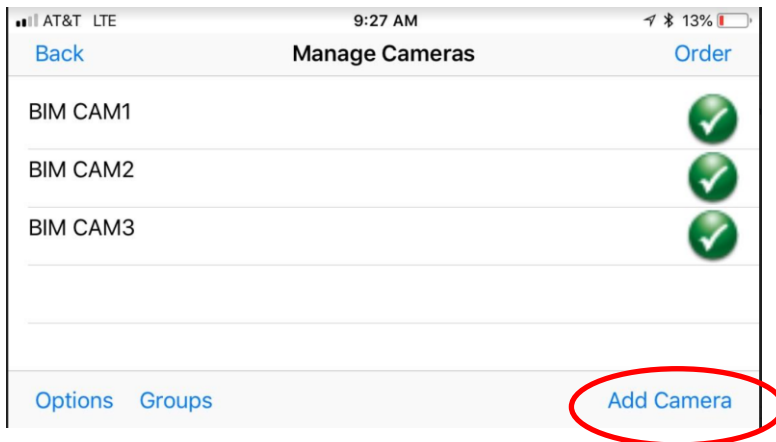


Select here to get to manage cameras

3. Select **Manage Cameras** from the drop down on the right




4. Select **Add a Camera** from the screen from the lower right.



5. From the menu below, select **IP Camera** from the dropdown



6. You will need to enter the following information below. Erase what is in the name field and enter in **BIM CAM1** in the name field.



7. Select the drop down to the right to select the make and model of the camera (circled below)

8. Search field screen may look like this for camera brand and type. Scroll thru list to find the ones shown. Then select **Back**.

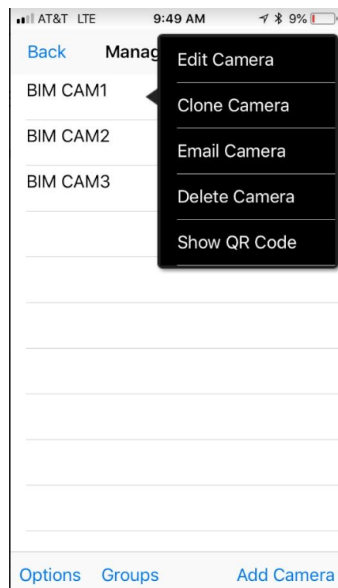


9. Erase the host web address field and type in **berkeleyislandmarine.dynalias.com**

10. Erase the Http port information and type in **554**. Select **Save**.

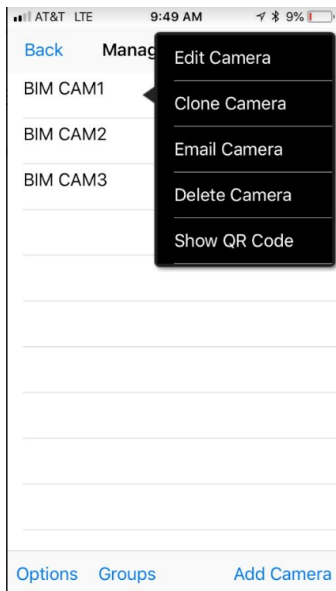
11. You will have to wait a minute or two for the camera to install. 554 will give you the fuel dock view. Once that is done, then you can add other cameras by doing the following.

12. Go back to manage cameras section. Select **BIM CAM1** by selecting the word BIM CAM1, not the green check mark. Select **Clone Camera**.



13. Change the Name to **BIM CAM2**. Change the Http port to **555**. Select **Save**. You now have the view of the Ramp dock and the Bay, along with your original Fuel dock camera.

14. To delete the default cameras that you might have (usually some foreign cams of highways, etc), go back to your manage cameras section. You will see your available cameras. Select the names (on the name, not the checkmark). You will see the option to delete the cameras. To get rid of them one at a time by selecting **Delete Camera**.



15. In the manage camera section, make sure the green check marks are highlighted for the cameras you want to see on the home screen.
